## **Johannesburg**

Johannesburg is the second largest city in Africa. Had it not been for the discovery of gold by prospector George Harrison though, the city probably wouldn't even be in existence. Harrison, who pegged the first claim on the reef, sold it for just £10 and disappeared without a trace! Known as the greatest gold-mining area on earth, this vibrant city is not just an industrial giant; it is the heart of the country's economy. From traditional 'muti' (medicine) shops to exclusive boutiques in upmarket malls, theatres, museums, cultural villages, restaurants, beautiful walks in indigenous gardens and more, Johannesburg is a diverse cultural melting pot, deserving of its name of 'iGoli' or 'City of Gold'.

#### InterContinental O.R. Tambo Airport Hotel

This 5-star hotel is conveniently situated at the airport hub and is only a 5-minute walk from the arrivals hall. The well-appointed rooms are tastefully decorated with subtle influences of Africa. Spacious showers with massage showerheads, comfy king beds with fluffy duvets, blackout curtains and soundproofing ensure a night of relaxation.

#### Central Kalahari Game Reserve, Botswana – Kalahari Plains Camp – 3 Nights

<u>Included</u>: All meals, local beverages, laundry service, daily activities, private guide\* & private vehicle\* (\*with private tour option).

## Central Kalahari Game Reserve (CKGR)

The Central Kalahari Game Reserve is the ultimate in 'remote' safari destinations. Covering over 50,000km², this reserve is the largest conservation area in the country and one of the largest in the world. It was, until very recently, closed to the public, although there have always been small groups of Bushmen living in the reserve. The area is a vast flat expanse of scrub-covered fossil dunes between ancient river valleys and supports a fascinating spectrum of desert-adapted wildlife and plants. Star attractions include the legendary Kalahari black-maned lion, brown hyena, honey badger, bat-eared fox, cape fox, caracal, gemsbok (oryx) as well as some of the world's best cheetah viewing.

<u>Kalahari Plains Camp</u> is situated in the north-eastern part of the reserve on the edge of one of the ancient 'dry' river valleys called Deception Valley. The camp comprises eight en-suite canvas units with a sleep-out above each from which to enjoy moonlit or star-studded nights. The main area consists of a lounge and dining area with a swimming pool and deck. Morning and afternoon game drives are offered as well as interpretive, guided Bushman walks. ## Okavango Delta - Chief's Camp - 3 Nights

## Okavango Delta

A maze of sparkling lagoons, meandering channels with papyrus-fringed banks and overgrown islands teeming with wildlife, Botswana's Okavango Delta lies like a sparkling jewel spread over the thirstlands and heart of the Kalahari Desert. The core protected area of the Okavango is the 1 million acre Moremi Game Reserve, the first nature reserve proclaimed by an African tribe on their own land and named in honour of one of the early chiefs. The central part of the Reserve is dominated by the 250 000 acre Chief's Island which used to be the sacred hunting ground of the tribal chiefs. Explore the Okavango Delta on game drives, while mokoro (dug-out canoe) trips are seasonal and motorised boat excursions and bush walks are offered in some areas only.

Named after Chief Moremi, <u>Sanctuary Chief's Camp</u> is located in the world-renowned Moremi Game Reserve. Chief's Island is one of the many islands created by the seasonal floodwaters of the Okavango Delta and is well-known for some of the finest game viewing in Southern Africa. The ten luxury thatch and tented bush suites are nestled in a jackalberry and sausage tree woodland, each boasting their own private dining area, outside seating area, plunge pool, and beautiful bathrooms which offer a spacious outdoor shower and a large bath tub. The main area houses a bar area, orientation room, fitness centre, swimming pool, sitting room, curio shop, library, reception and both indoor and outdoor dining areas.

## **Chobe National Park – Chobe Chilwero Lodge – 2 Nights**

#### Chobe National Park

This National Park was proclaimed in 1967 and its 2,75 million acres is home to arguably the largest single elephant population in Africa (65 000) along with a host of other herbivores and carnivores. The habitat is mostly broad-leaved woodland with most of the game concentrating along the Chobe River — itself a tributary of the Zambezi — in the north of the park. This river forms the international boundary with Namibia and its confluence with the Zambezi a few miles downstream of the town of Kasane is unique in being the meeting point of 4 countries — namely Botswana, Namibia, Zambia and Zimbabwe. Game-viewing activities include game drives, boat trips and fishing (the latter in Namibian waters).

#### Chobe Chilwero Lodge

Sitting above the Chobe River, this small 'boutique lodge' comprises just 15 spacious chalets and offers unparalleled panoramic views across the islands and floodplains. Each chalet features a private garden with a hammock as well as en-suite facilities that include a bath, indoor and outdoor shower. The public areas offer extensive indoor and outdoor dining areas, a library with satellite television, a curio shop, swimming pool and spa.

## Bordering Mosi-oa-Tunya National Park, Livingstone – Sussi & Chuma Lodge – 2 Nights

## Livingstone and Mosi-oa-Tunya National Park

The town of Livingstone has become Zambia's tourist capital. It is a bustling town of 200 000 people and is the only place in the country that has maintained its name given by the British when the country was a colony, all other names having been changed to local African names since independence. This is testament to the reverence with which the local people still hold the name of David Livingstone, the famous missionary / doctor / explorer who spent a lot of time in the area and was the first European to see the Falls, naming them in honour of Queen Victoria. Most visitors are drawn to the historic town for Victoria Falls, but the town has attractions of its own, most notably an interesting colonial history combined with a very African ambience. The Livingstone Museum, housing a collection of David Livingstone memorabilia including letters, clothing, and medicine box, is the oldest museum in Zambia. Highlights also include Tonga ritual artifacts, a life-size model African village, and displays depicting the transition to independence. There are a number of adventure sports in and around Livingstone and the Falls and river cruises on the Zambezi.

Livingstone is situated a short distance from the Victoria Falls, the largest single waterfall in the world by volume in peak flood and a member of the old Seven Natural Wonders of the World (the new Seven Wonders excludes this waterfall). Described by the Kololo tribe living in the area in the 1800's as 'Mosi-oa-Tunya' – meaning 'The smoke that thunders' – Victoria Falls are a spectacular sight on the Zambezi River, bordering Zambia and Zimbabwe. Columns of spray can be seen from many miles away as 750 000 tons of water plummet over the edge every minute at the height of the flood season. The Falls are I mile (1,5km) wide and average 350 feet (100m) high. The wide basalt cliff, over which the falls thunder, transforms the Zambezi from a wide placid river to a ferocious torrent cutting through a series of dramatic gorges. Facing the Falls is another sheer wall of basalt, rising to the same height and capped by mist-soaked rain forest. A path along the edge of the forest provides the visitor who is prepared to brave the tremendous spray with an unparalleled series of views of the Falls. One special vantage point is across the Knife-Edge Bridge where visitors can have the finest view of the Eastern Cataract and the Main Falls as well as the Boiling Pot where the river turns and heads down the Batoka Gorge. Other vantage points include the Falls Bridge and the Lookout Tree that commands a panoramic view across the Main Falls. Mosi-oa-Tunya NP, a protected area of 16,500 acres literally abuts the town and is home to a wide diversity of animals – including the country's only white rhino – but lacks predators.



#### Sussi & Chuma Lodge

This beautiful lodge comprises 12 luxury 'tree-houses' that are built into the canopy of majestic ebony trees lining the river bank, 12 km's upstream of the Victoria Falls. The air-conditioned rooms all with their own private viewing deck boast superb views over the white waters of the Zambezi. The main lodge commands prime position overlooking a magnificent stretch of rapids and comprises a lounge, bar, dining room, pool, spa, and numerous decks overlooking the river.
